Work-in-Progress: Helado Negro: Island Universe Story

Conjuring Strange and Beautiful Sound



North Adams, Massachusetts — Roberto Carlos Lange, aka Helado Negro, produces bi-lingual music that is "a sonic landscape that reflects 21st-century Latin America" (NPR). Fresh off a release on Sufjan Stevens' Asthmatic Kitty label, Lange sets out on his new musical/visual project Island Universe Story, which will be developed at MASS MoCA with a team of eight musicians including

Mikael Jorgensen of Wilco, David Byrne percussionist Jason Trammell, and members of the William Onyeabor Atomic Bomb Band and Marc Ribot's band. **Helado Negro** will perform a work-in-progress concert of his latest project, *Island Universe Story*, at MASS MoCA on **Saturday**, **January 24**, at **8pm**.

Born into the vivid colors and pounding boom box beats of 1980s south Florida, experimental electronic producer and performer Lange incorporates the sensual tropical storms and irresistible Latin groove of his childhood into the eclectic, reflective sound of his most recent musical identity, Helado Negro. Spanish for "black ice cream," Helado Negro's style is at once primal and sophisticated, characterized by layers of ethereal Latin rhythms and contemporary beats that combine Lange's rich, soulful voice and poetic lyrics in hypnotic soundscapes that have earned him the title of "experimental psych maestro" (*Pitchfork*). A multitasker on stage, Lange merges music and art in mesmerizing multimedia performances that often incorporate video, laser lights, fog, and backup dancers.

Lange made his musical debut in the early 2000s, releasing numerous full-length albums under various monikers, mostly notably a collaboration with drummer Matt Crum called ROM and a solo effort under the name Epstein. Helgado Negro made its album debut in 2009 with Awe Owe, following up with

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2011's Canta Lechuza, 2013's Invisible Life, and most recently, Double Youth in 2014, all produced by Asthmatic Kitty Records. Lange is no stranger to working behind the scenes; he produced Brooklynbased synth-pop group Bear in Heaven's 2009 breakout Beast Rest Forth Mouth, hailed as some of the year's "best new music" by Pitchfork.

At MASS MoCA, he brings together eight musicians to explore and create a mosaic of sound for his music and (eventually) video project, *Island Universe Story*, set to premiere in March 2015 with the Liquid Music concert series. The MASS MoCA work-in-progress performance features project collaborators including Trammell, singer-songwriter Adron, and Wilco keyboardist Jorgensen.

Helado Negro performs in MASS MoCA's Hunter Center on Saturday, January 24, at 8pm. Dinner and snacks are available from Lickety Split before and during the show. A full bar serves Berkshire Brewing Company beers and Berkshire Mountain Distillery spirits. Tickets are \$8 for students, \$12 in advance, \$18 day of, and \$22 preferred. Tickets for all events are available through the MASS MoCA box office located on Marshall Street in North Adams, open 11am - 5pm Wednesdays through Mondays; closed Tuesdays through spring 2015.
