Teen Art Summit

Free Improv Theater, Yoga, Music-Making for Local Youth



North Adams, Massachusetts — MASS MoCA and MCLA seek northern Berkshire teens (ages 13-19) to participate in five hours of improv theater, studio art, collective music-making, yoga, and more, all while connecting with other teens, college students, and artists. The Teen Art Summit affords teens the opportunity to contribute their ides to a think tank for future visual and performing art programs to take place at MASS MoCA and throughout the community. Dinner, t-shirts, and special

giveaways are provided. The Summit is free and held at MASS MoCA on May 1, from 4 to 9pm.

MASS MoCA also offers an opportunity for teen artists in its summer residency, July 9 through July 30. Participants collaborate with artist Kathleen Carr to design and create an immersive cardboard city for a monthlong installation in a public space in downtown North Adams. The teens strengthen skills through the mentorship of a practicing artist, experience the opportunity of a public audience for their artwork, and explore issues of waste, repurposing, and recycling. The Teen Summer Residency is free and open to all participants with an interest in the arts... and pizza! Creative curiosity is a must, but experience is not required.

Teen Art Summit project partners and workshop leaders this year include MCLA Arts Administration students, along with staff of the Northern Berkshire Community Coalition (nbCC) and the Common Folk Artist Collective.
