Institute of Museum and Library Services awards over \$100,000 to support educational programming at MASS MoCA

NORTH ADAMS, MASSACHUSETTS — The Institute of Museum And Library Services (IMLS) has selected MASS MoCA for one of its Museums for America awards, providing over \$100,000 in support for the pilot year of the museum's new educational initiative, Art for Change, a program designed to deepen programming and build a better understanding of the impact of its 15-year partnership with North Adams and Northern Berkshire public school students.

Art for Change (A4C) is a four-year (2015–2019) programmatic and evaluation project based on Kidspace, the museum's child-centered gallery and art-making space that provides arts education experiences through curated, theme-based exhibition projects in partnership with local schools. The A4C project creates thematic arts education programming under a single narrative and developmental arc that enforces positive habits of mind, through four identified themes of **empathy**, **optimism**, and **courage**, which are fundamental to a child's ability to **problem solve**. Each year's theme will build on the previous one and involves the development of a sophisticated platform of exhibitions and related programs.

It Takes a Village (October 2015–September 2016), the start-up phase of the A4C project, is the pilot year of this initiative. The program allows Kidspace to expand partnerships with community and school partners, increase school programming, and institute a much-needed evaluation system for school partners orchestrated by a professional evaluation team. Learning experiences center on two thematic exhibitions that delve in to empathy and optimism, with museum field trips, art-making, artist residencies, performances, teacher workshops, and curriculum development for 2,400 pre-K through eighth grade students.

It Takes a Village pilots the first year of a longitudinal evaluation of Kidspace's relationship with local partner schools and puts in place an accurate data collection mechanism to effectively measure impact and track results over the long-term.

This year, the IMLS received 521 applications requesting \$53,903,405. Of these, 202 projects were selected to receive funding totaling \$20,207,105. IMLS's peer review panel evaluates all eligible and complete grant applications, assessing the merit of each proposal and its fit with the goals of the grant program and project category. Kidspace at MASS MoCA is a child-centered art gallery and hands-on studio that presents exhibitions and educational experiences in collaboration with leading artists. Currently, Kidspace features the exhibition *Walk in My Shoes* (on view through May 23, 2016), which features artwork chosen to activate

empathic responses and amplify awareness of one's feelings and compassion towards others. Kidspace offers free public hours during the school year, from 11am-5pm every day except Tuesdays, with art-making on the weekends and during school holidays. During the summer, Kidspace is open from 10am–6pm Sundays through Wednesdays, and 10am–7pm Thursdays through Saturdays, with art-making every day.
