

Love Marriage in Kabul

To help an orphan and his star-crossed lover, a strong-willed woman challenges tradition to make magic



NORTH ADAMS, MASSACHUSETTS — Mahboba Rawi is a strong-willed Afghan-Australian who dedicates her life to helping orphans in Afghanistan. With one month and limited resources, Rawi must challenge traditions to make a marriage of love happen in Kabul— the fate of two star-crossed lovers rests with her. *Love Marriage in Kabul* screens at MASS MoCA on Thursday, March 10, at 7:30pm, in the third installment of MASS MoCA's annual documentary series, *Love is Complicated*.

Through her work in her non-governmental organization, Mahboba's Promise, Rawi acts as a mother figure to thousands of orphans and widows in Afghanistan. *Love Marriage in Kabul* follows her extraordinary quest to secure the marriage of Abdul, an orphan she saved, and Fatemah, the girl he loves, whose father demands a large dowry that Abdul cannot pay. Fighting against all odds, Rawi challenges time and tradition to prevent an arranged marriage. This compassionate film utilizes understated editing to tell a raw, realistic story that allows Rawi and her passion for advocacy and justice to take center stage. While Abdul and Fatemah's love story drives the film, *Love Marriage in Kabul* offers a look at the realities of daily life in Afghanistan, the financial and emotional struggles Rawi faces maintaining her nonprofit, and the extent of her selfless commitment to the women and children of Afghanistan.

The director of *Love Marriage in Kabul*, Amin Palangi, is an Iranian-born Australian director, writer, and producer, and the founder of Palangi Productions. His mission as a filmmaker is to break down Western stereotypes of the Middle East and humanize its people through film. *Audiences Everywhere* praises Palangi's portrayal of Afghanistan in *Love Marriage in Kabul*, calling it "refreshing to see a side of the country outside of news clips that would try to make you believe it is a place filled only with violence. There's a lot of love in this film, and while there are setbacks and some uncomfortable moments where tradition trumps freedom, *Love Marriage in Kabul* is a positive depiction of Afghanistan and its people."

Love Marriage in Kabul screens in MASS MoCA's Club B10 on Thursday, March 10, at 7:30pm. Following the screening, director Palangi will join via Skype for a Q+A. A full bar serves Berkshire Brewing Company beers and Berkshire Mountain Distillery spirits. Tickets are \$5 for students and members, and \$9 general admission.
