MASS MoCA is free for all on January 26

History Harvest, art projects, live music, performances, and gallery tours



NORTH ADAMS, MASSACHUSETTS — Amplify your MASS MoCA experience when we throw open our doors for free and fill the galleries with art-making activities, lively discussion, and pop-up performances at our annual Free Day. Create some art, take a tour, catch some live music in the elevator, and learn about the history of life on Marshall Street on Saturday, January 26, from 11am to 7pm.

Free Day visitors can dive deep into the history of MASS MoCA and its vast Marshall Street complex with MASS MoCA's founding director Joseph Thompson, who will talk about more than 200 years of economic, industrial, and architectural change in North Adams. Visitors are encouraged to participate in a "History Harvest" by bringing in printed

photos, tickets, or ephemera from past visits to MASS MoCA, to be scanned and saved in a digital archive. Or share printed material, photos, or artifacts from Sprague Electric, Arnold Print Works, or other North Adams moments. Share images to social media by tagging #mmhistoryharvest.

Throughout the day, activities are designed to engage visitors with the museum's expanse of visual art galleries and community-generated performance, including pop-ups by Pittsfield-based Youth Alive step dance and drum band troupe, and Berkshire Dance Theatre. Stop by our photo booth in the Sol LeWitt galleries to memorialize the day; create take-home projects; contribute to community art projects; and entertain your kids with a museum-wide scavenger hunt.

In Kidspace, visitors' senses will be stimulated by art projects inspired by Sally Taylor's exhibition *Come to Your Senses: Art to See, Smell, Hear, Taste, and Touch*, available all day at the ArtBar.
